**Michael Kopko '07** is Head of Business Development at Oscar Health Insurance, working in sales and development strategies. He also spent four years at Bridgewater Associates and is building a non-profit to promote public service among young people. In 2009, he sold DormAid, which he launched while a student at Harvard and Columbia. Michael has appeared in major media outlets including Fox News, The New York Times, and The Daily Show.

**Shubha Lakshmi Bhat '09** studied economics and health policy while at Harvard and founded the Health Advocacy Program to promote health behavior change in underserved communities. She received her medical degree from Stanford, where she conducted research on diabetes and obesity and studied health entrepreneurship and design at Stanford. She is currently a resident in internal medicine at Brigham and Women's Hospital.

**Emily Cunningham '13** is co-founder and CEO of MoringaConnect, a social enterprise dedicated to connecting smallholder farmers to the global market. While at Harvard, she studied economics, focusing on developing economies. She worked extensively with MIT's D-Lab, developing a Gates Foundation award-winning multicrop thresher. She has traveled extensively in India and Ghana working in microfinance and small enterprise development.

**Sam Himel '13** is a Research Assistant at the White House Council of Economic Advisers. Sam focuses primarily on housing, infrastructure, and industrial organization. Prior to joining the CEA, he worked at the Institute for Defense Analyses. While at Harvard, Sam received a Thomas T. Hoopes Prize for his senior thesis, in which he investigates the relationship between US drone strikes and anti-American sentiment in Pakistan.
